

**POTTSTOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT
MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
January 20, 2011**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of School Directors of the Pottstown School District was held on Thursday, January 20, 2011 at 7:30 PM in the second floor LGI room of the Pottstown Middle School with President Richard C. Huss presiding. Upon roll call, the following members were present: Mr. Robert H. Hartman, Jr., Mr. Thomas J. Hylton, Mrs. Michele Pargeon, Mrs. Polly Weand, and Mr. Dennis Wausnock. Absent were Ms. Harris, Mrs. Wilson and Mr. White. Also present were Superintendent, Dr. Reed Lindley; Assistant Superintendent, Dr. Jeffrey Sparagana; Board Secretary, Mrs. Linda S. Adams; Solicitor, Mr. Stephen Kalis, Mr. John Armato, Ms. Terri Lampe, Mrs. Gail Cooper, Mrs. Loretta Hoch, Mrs. Rita Cohen, Ms. Pamela Bateson, Mr. Scott Ware, a member of the press, and interested citizens.

COMMUNICATIONS

Mr. Kalis provided an update on the Fact Finding hearing that took place on January 18, 2011. He reported that the Fact Finder will review the information and present his findings no later than January 31, 2011. Each party then has 10 days to approve or reject the findings; if rejected, there is a reconsideration period of 10 days with an opportunity to approve or reject a second time. At that time the findings would be made public and the parties would then go back to the bargaining table.

PRESENTATIONS

Mrs. Adams presented a Power Point Presentation on the Preliminary Budget for 2011-2012. She explained the budget timeline under Act 1 and the assumptions used to develop the budget. Mrs. Adams reviewed the Expenditures by Function and by Object. The Financial Summary reflects a budget deficit of \$707,272 after applying the allowable millage increase under Act 1 of 1.9% or .6992 mills. The millage increase under Act 1 would result in total mills of 36.8232. The budget is proposed at a level that exceeds the Act index, which then qualifies the district to apply for exceptions under the Act. Application of exceptions does not require the district to use the exceptions in balancing the

budget for final approval. The Preliminary Budget for 2011-2012 will be placed on the February 3, 2011 Committee of the Whole agenda for approval.

Dr. Lindley presented a written communication regarding budget implications. A copy of this communication will be posted to the website and an addendum (#2010-2011-047) will be filed in the Secretary's office. Dr. Lindley's communication

Dr. Sparagana reviewed the January PEAK report. He spoke about the development of a strategic plan to pursue new resources and seek funding to sustain the PEAK Program. Dr. Sparagana announced that during the 1st semester the district had 19 Interns from West Chester University volunteering their services in our elementary and middle schools. Dr. Lindley confirmed that Interns are in place for the 2nd Semester also. Dr. Sparagana reminded the Board Members of the Lincoln Parent Talk Series that will take place on January 24, 2011. He spoke about a Pre-Service project to place approximately 10 Pre-Service Teachers from Lincoln University throughout the elementary schools and high school. Dr. Spargana invited the Board Members to attend the Welcome Reception on January 31st for the Pre-Service Teachers. The project will take place two days a week and continue until March 31st, 2011.

5. Webmaster Report

FEDERATION REMARKS

Mrs. Vollmuth stated that the Franklin students were a wonderful representation of the successes that take place in the Pottstown Schools every day. She commented on the creativity and ideas that are generated throughout the buildings. She stated that is the hope of the Federation that the Administration and Board Members engage that creativity to help deal with the budget and staffing issues.

Mrs. Wilson attended the Rupert Family Activity Night held this evening. It was sponsored by the Health and Family Services.

Mrs. Pargeon was pleased to attend the Martin Luther King celebration at the Second Baptist Church. She reminded the Board Members of the Career & Tech Education night on January 26th. It was a pleasure to hear the writing awards.

Mr. Hartman thanked the students for their writings. He understands the significance of Personnel costs representing 65% of the budget. Mr. Hartman thanked Dr. Lindley for his comments and not saying what the Board may want to hear, but what the Board needs to hear.

Mrs. Weand thanked Dr. Lindley for his remarks. She stated that it is obvious that Dr. Lindley is taking the initiative to find ways to provide the best education for our students. Mrs. Weand thanked Mrs. Adams for all her hard work.

Dr. Sparagana – no comment.

Dr. Lindley stated that as a Board and a community it is important to recognize “that we will most likely never agree on grade level configuration, budget priorities.” He stressed the importance of listening to the people who disagree and make sure that as a Board and community we come to the best decision possible.


Mr. Wausnock – no comment.

Mrs. Adams explained that the 65% level of Personnel and Benefits represented in the budget a lower percentage than other districts. She explained that the school district does spend a higher percentage on maintaining the buildings than other districts. Mrs. Adams noted that a lot of other districts spend approximately 70% to 75% of their budget on Personnel and Benefits.

Mr. Huss thanked the Administration for being frugal in spending money. He talked about the responsibility of the Task Force and what needs to be achieved in the next five months. Mr. Huss thanked Mrs. Adams and her staff, Dr. Lindley, Dr. Spargana and Mr. Kalis for all the time and effort they have put forth during the past several months.

ADJOURNMENT

It was moved by Mr. Hartman and seconded by Mr. Wausnock and that the Board adjourns. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 9:11 P.M.
