

**POTTSTOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT

February 17, 2011**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of School Directors of the Pottstown School District was held on Thursday, February 17, 2011 at 7:30 PM in the second floor LGI room of the Pottstown Middle School with President Richard C. UPDATE ON TEACHERS' CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS

Mr. Kalis provided an update on the Fact Finding process. He stated that the Pottstown Federation of Teachers had rejected the Fact Finder's Report for the second time. He explained the Fact Finder's report offered a substantial salary increase. The Board unanimously accepted the Fact Finder's recommendations which asked the Federation to accept the district's Core Health Plan. The Core Health Plan has been accepted by the Support Staff, The Act 93 group and the entire Executive Team. Mr. Kalis stated that the Federation did not believe the Core Health Plan was good enough for them. The Bargaining Team for the Board is ready to meet with the Bargaining Team for the Federation if directed by the state mediator. Mr. Kalis suggested having an insurance consultant provide a comparison of the health plans at a future Board meeting giving the Board an opportunity to review the plans and get answers to any questions they may have. The Board agreed that Mr. Kalis would make the arrangements for a presentation at the March 3, 2011 Committee of the Whole Meeting.

Mr. Hylton stated that he cannot vote in favor of Act 93 salary increases in these current economic times. Mrs. Pargeon voiced her support to compensate the Administrators for their leadership and initiative in accepting the Core Health Program. She asked the Board to support a four year extension of the Act 93 Agreement. Mr. Kalis confirmed that approval of the amended agreement would take place at the next voting meeting.

The vote to table the Director of Development salary was recorded as follows: Mr. White: aye, Mrs. Wilson: nay, Ms. Harris: aye, Mr. Huss: nay, Mr. Hylton: aye, Mrs. Pargeon: nay, Mr. Wausnock: nay, Mrs. Weand: nay. Ayes: three. Nays: five. Absent: one. Motion denied.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE FORWARD BORROWING

The Finance Committee recommends the Board approve the Resolution extending the date of issuance of the bonds authorizing and directing the incurrence of non-electoral debt through issuance of general obligation bonds as presented.

It was moved by Mrs. Pargeon and seconded by Mrs. Weand that the Board approve the Resolution extending the date of issuance of the bonds authorizing and directing the incurrence of non-electoral debt through issuance of general obligation bonds

Mr. Hylton stated that he does not support additional forward borrowing. He stated that the district has the ability to borrow \$28 million and this amount is far more that the district could afford to pay back. He reminded the Board Members who ran on a pledge of fiscal responsibility. Mrs. Weand asked Mr. Hylton what has changed from back in 2007 when he strongly supported forward borrowing to the point of threatening a lawsuit. Mr. Hylton had no comment. Mrs. Weand explained that forward borrowing allows the district to access capital, if needed. She does not feel the district would need \$50 million for any refurbishing that the President’s Task Force may recommend but believes the district should not pass by an opportunity to improve the education of the students. Mrs. Pargeon expressed her disappointment that discussion is still centered on keeping five elementary schools. She stated that the district will need capital for any renovations and she stressed the importance of doing renovations that will support the district’s educational needs for the next 20 years. Mr. Hylton stated that Crabtree,

Rohrbach and Associates had proposed renovations for what really had to be done at a cost under \$15 million. He was confident that the cost benefit analysis will show that doing the basic renovations on the five existing elementary schools will be far less than new construction for additions to any of the existing buildings. Mrs. Pargeon voiced her disagreement with continuing to put money into five elementary schools.

Upon roll call the vote to approve the Forward Borrowing Resolution was recorded as follows: Mrs. Wilson: nay, Ms. Harris: nay, Mr. Huss: aye, Mr. Hylton: nay, Mrs. Pargeon: aye, Mr. Wausnock: aye, Mrs. Weand: aye, Mr. White: nay. Ayes: four. Nays: four. Absent: one. Motion denied.

RESERVING FUNDS FOR FUTURE PSERS INCREASES

The Finance Committee recommends the Board approve reserving funds in the amount of \$919,153.84 for future PSERS rate increases as presented.

It was moved by Mr. Wausnock and seconded by Mrs. Pargeon that the Board approve Reserving Funds for Future PSERS increases as presented and a copy be filed in the Secretary's office as addendum #2010-2011-057.

Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Ayes: eight. Nays: none. Absent: one. Motion carried.

CHESTNUT STREET PROPERTY/COMMUNITY GARDEN

The Facilities Committee recommends that the Superintendent work with the solicitor to prepare an agreement for Board approval that transfers 423 Chestnut Street to Preservation Pottstown/Community Land Trust for the purpose of developing a Community Garden. The agreement is to stipulate that the property return to the school district should it no longer be used as a Community Garden.

It was moved by Mr. Wausnock and seconded by Ms. Harris that the Board approve the Superintendent work with the solicitor to prepare an agreement for Board approval that transfers 423 Chestnut Street to Preservation Pottstown/Community Land Trust for the purpose of developing a Community Garden. The agreement is to stipulate that the property return to the school district should it no longer be used as a Community Garden.

Mrs. Weand asked for clarification that the vote is for the concept of an agreement. Mr. Kalis stated that the vote is to authorize Dr. Lindley to work toward a draft agreement for further discussion.

Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Ayes: eight. Nays: none. Absent: one. Motion carried.

Mrs. Weand – no comment.

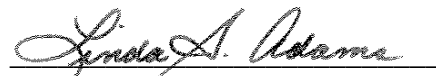

The private schools don't have to accept the student even if they have a voucher.
